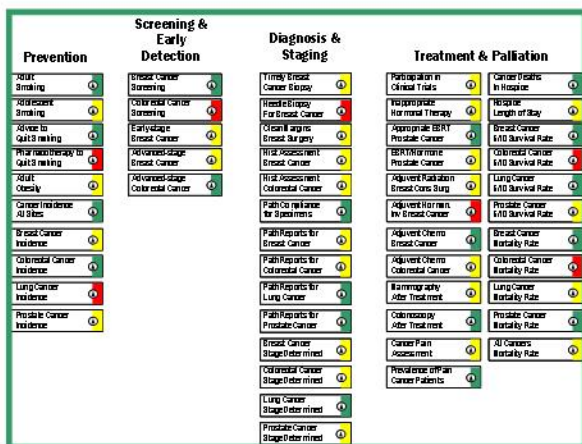


## What is The Dashboard?

The **Dashboard** is a tool for reporting progress in quality of cancer care to constituencies throughout the state of Georgia. It will provide information on 52 indicators across the cancer care continuum:

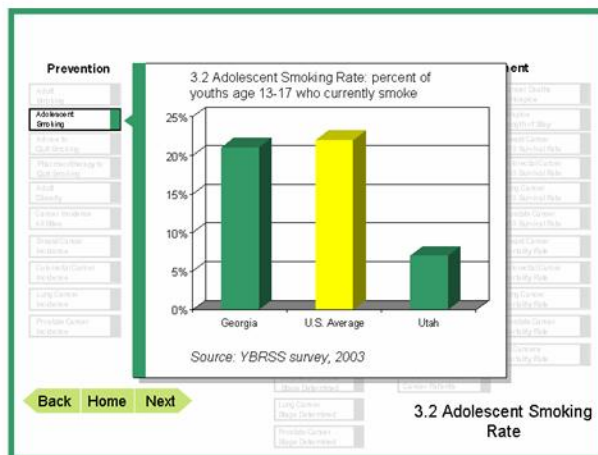
- Prevention
- Early Detection and Screening
- Diagnosis and Staging
- Treatment and Palliation



## Key Features

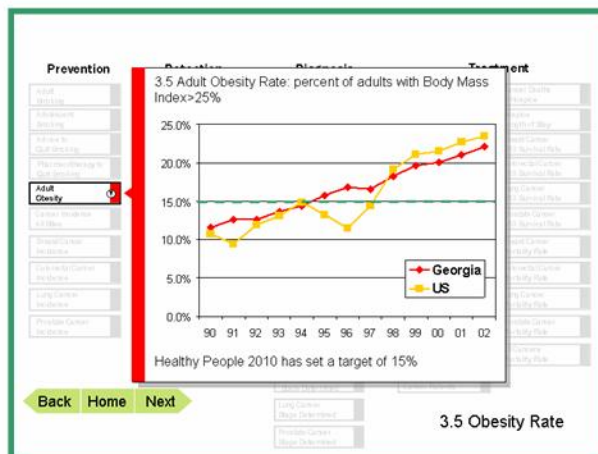
The Dashboard will be available to multiple stakeholders:

- Providers
- Researchers
- Patients
- Survivors
- Employers
- Payors
- Federal and State agencies
- Public health personnel



With benchmarks and goals established for the 52 indicators, The Dashboard will allow comparison of Georgia with the nation as a whole and will also show areas of improving, steady or declining trends.

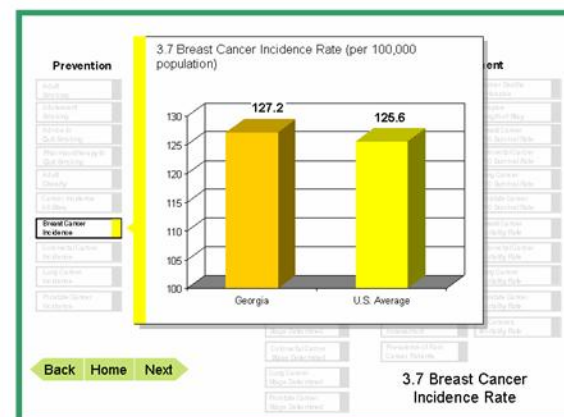
Dashboard users will be able to “drill down” for more detailed data where available—for example, by geographic region, age, gender or race.



Each provider contributing data to The Dashboard will see their performance relative to the state's. Public reporting, however, will be at an aggregated level only.

Individual patient identities will be securely protected through encryption.

Demonstration partners, disease site clinical teams and others involved will collaborate on best practices and strategies for improving patient care and outcomes.



All 52 metrics will be collected from providers across the state, ultimately to reflect at least 80% of all new cancer cases in Georgia.

As Electronic Medical Record adoption spreads, the timeliness of Dashboard data will increase to approach real-time reporting. Expanded indicator sets will also be possible.
